

Checklist: HGV Vehicle Check

Checklist for damages

This checklist is only intended as an initial orientation. Before you use the checklist, it is essential that you seek advice from legally qualified third parties and adapt it to your requirements. Proper documentation is recommended and should be supplemented with photographs in the event of damage. You should also make sure to ask about any previous repairs or accidents that took place and at what time.

What to Check Inside the Vehicle:		
1. Brakes		
Does the foot or service brake work correctly? Does it have any excessive travel?		
Does the hand or parking brake work correctly? Does it have any excessive travel?		
2. Horn and Steering		
Is the horn easily accessible from the driver's seat?		
Does the horn work when its control is operated?		
Does the steering wheel have any excessive play?		
3. Lights		
Do all lights and indicators work?		
Are all lenses present and clean? Are they all the right color?		
Do all stop lamps come on when the service brake is applied? Do they go out when the brake is released?		
Are all marker lights present? Do they all work?		
Are all dashboard warning lamps in working order? These warning lamps include:		
The automatic braking system (ABS)		
Airbags - supplemental restraint system (SRS)		
Electronic positioning system (EPS)		
Full beam headlamp and warning lamp		
Parking brake warning lamp		
4. Mirrors and glass		
Are all mirrors aligned and secure?		
Do you have a clear view of the road in all directions?

5. Seats and seatbelts			
	Are the seatbelts secure?		
	Do the seatbelts work correctly?		
	Are the seatbelts free of cuts and / or damage?		
6. W	6. Washers and wipers		
	Do the wipers move continually when they're switched on?		
	Do the wiper blades clear the windscreen effectively when used with the washers?		
	Do the washers point at the windscreen?		
	Are the washers operational?		
	Is the washer fluid topped up?		
Wh	at to Check Inside the Vehicle:		
1. Battery			
	Is the battery held in place by the correct means? (i.e. NOT cables)		
	Is the battery not leaking?		
2. Fluids, Fuel & Oil			
	Are the levels correct for the following: brake fluid, engine coolant, engine oil, power steering fluid, windscreen washer fluid and water.		
	Is the fuel filler cap secure?		
	Do you see leaks from any of the following: brake fluid, power steering fluid or water.		
	Have you turned the engine on to check for leaks while the vehicle is running?		
3. Bodywork and doors			
	Do all doors shut and secure properly once closed?		
	Is there any damage or sharp edges on the vehicle?		
	Are any body panels loose or in danger of falling off?		
4. E	4. Exhaust		
	Does the exhaust emit excessive amounts of smoke?

5. Tyres and wheels		
Do the tyres and wheels meet the following requirements?		
	A minimum tread depth of 1.6mm	
	Sufficient inflation of each tyre	
	No deep cuts in the sidewall	
	No cord visible anywhere on the tyre	
	No missing or insecure wheel-nuts	
6. Load		
	If there's a load, is it properly secured?	
	Do the vehicle doors have an effective locking device?	
7. Tow bars and tail lifts		
	Is the tow bar secure?	
	If there's a trailer, is it correctly and securely attached? Do all electrical connections work correctly?	
	Is the tail lift secure and free from damage? Does it function correctly? Are the electrics working?
