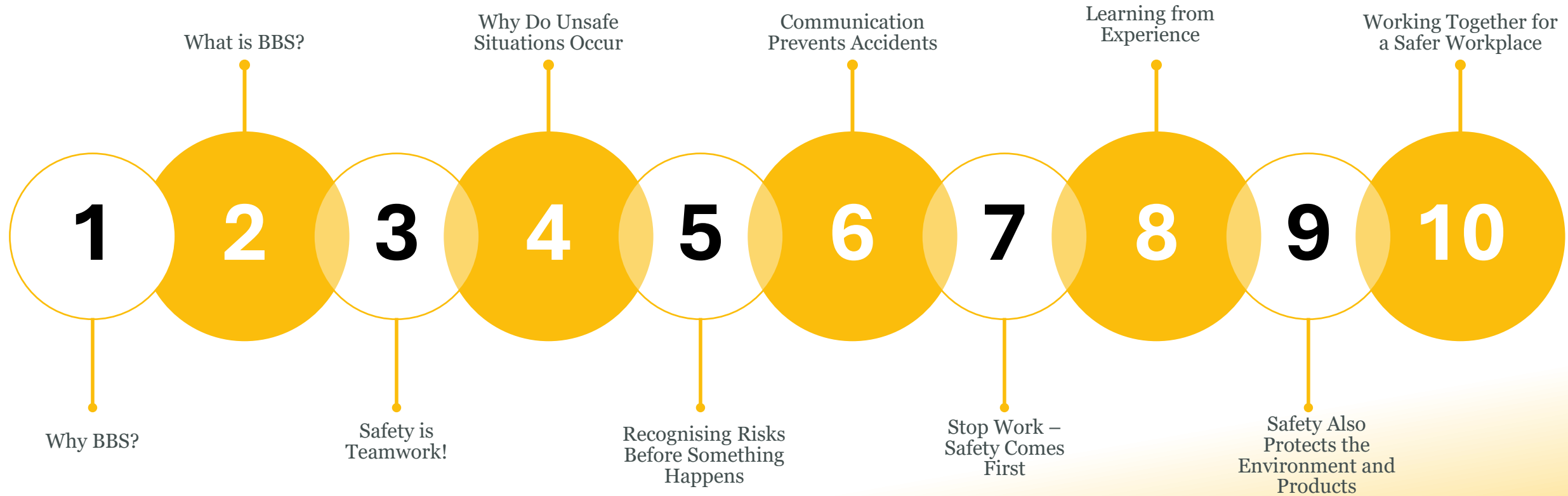

Safe Behavior Starts with You!



Why Behavior Based Safety (BBS)?

Safety does not happen by chance.

Every day, we make decisions.

Most of them are routine – but some can have serious consequences for people, the environment, property and the supply chain.

Behavior Based Safety (BBS) helps us to:

- recognise risks at an early stage;
- make conscious and safe decisions;
- speak up about unsafe situations;
- and prevent accidents and near misses.

What is Behavior Based Safety (BBS)?

Behavior Based Safety (BBS) means recognising risks, acting safely and taking responsibility for your own Behaviour as well as the safety of others.

At SUN, Behaviour Based Safety is based on four core principles:



Recognise Risks

Identify hazards at an early stage and assess them consciously.



Act Safely

Safe behavior always precedence over time pressure or routine.



Take Responsibility

Everyone contributes to the safety of others through their own behavior.



Improve Together

Learn from observations, near misses and experience.

Safety is Teamwork!

Safety is achieved through the combined efforts of everyone involved.
Everyone shares responsibility for ensuring safe transport operations.



Drivers

Act safely and responsibly.
Identify and report risks and deviations.



Dispatch Department

Provides complete and accurate information.
Supports drivers in case of questions or unsafe situations.



Subcontractors

Provide qualified drivers and suitable vehicles.
Ensure compliance with the agreed requirements.



Management

Creates the conditions for safe working.
Promotes an open safety culture and continuous improvement.

Why Do Unsafe Situations Occur

Unsafe situations are rarely caused by a single mistake.
In most cases, several factors contribute at same time.

The most common causes include:



Routine

Familiar tasks are often performed automatically. As a result, potential risks may be overlooked.



Time Pressure

Time pressure can lead to safety measures being shortened, bypass or omitted.



Missing or Unclear Information

Incomplete transport information or misunderstandings increase the risk of poor decisions.



Distraction

A lack of attention – for example due to phone calls or other distractions – can result in dangerous situations.



Poor Communication

Failing to speak up about risks or uncertainties increases the likelihood that they will develop into an incident.

Most accidents give warning signs. By staying alert, risks can often be identified before damage or injury occurs.

Pay particular attention to:

Information

- Is all transport information complete?
- Are there any customer-specific requirements?
- Are the loading and unloading locations clearly defined?

Vehicle and Equipment

- Is the vehicle in a roadworthy condition?
- Is all required safety equipment and personal equipment (PPE) available?
- Is the cargo securing equipment ready for use?

Work Environment

- Are there any hazards caused by other vehicles or material handling equipment?
- Are traffic routes clear and properly marked?
- Are emergency exits and emergency equipment known?

Behaviour

- Are safety rules being followed?
- Is there any time pressure or uncertainty?
- Is communication open and effective?

Communication Prevents Accidents

Safe transport operations begins with complete information and open communication.

Everyone plays an important role in preventing misunderstandings and reducing risks.

Drivers



Ask questions whenever information is missing or unclear.
Report unsafe situations, near misses and deviations immediately.
Do not continue working if there are significant safety concerns.

Dispatch Department

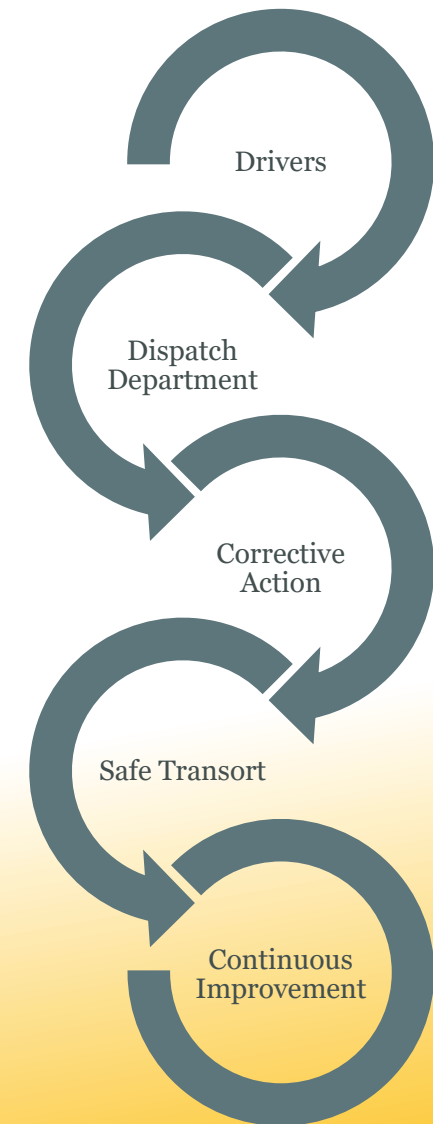


Provides complete and clear transport information.
Supports drivers in case of questions or uncertainties.
Takes reports seriously and initiates the necessary actions.

Working Together



Raise concerns at an early stage.
Share information completely accurately.
Learn from feedback and implement improvements.



Stop Work – Safety Comes First

Everyone has the right and the responsibility to stop unsafe work.

If a task cannot be carried out safely:



- Do not start work, or stop immediately if it is already in progress.
- Assess the hazard and secure this area.
- Inform the Dispatch Department or the responsible contact person.
- Resume work only after the situation has been clarified and it is safe to do so.



Stop Work is required, for example, if:

- required safety measures are missing;
- instructions are unclear or contradictory;
- People are at risk;
- Required personal protective equipment (PPE) is missing;
- The vehicle or equipment is not safe to use;
- There are significant safety concerns during loading or unloading.

Every report helps prevent future accidents and incidents.

Not only accidents provide valuable lessons.
Near misses, unsafe situations and deviations also help us identify where improvements are needed.

We therefore report:



- Accidents
- Near misses
- Unsafe Situations
- Safety deviations
- Environmental incidents
- Damage or product spills



Safety Also Protects the Environment and Products

Behavior Based Safety goes beyond protecting people.

Safe behavior also protects:

- The environment
- The products we transport
- Our customers
- Our company

Everyone can contribute:

- Prevent leaks and product spills.
- Keep loading areas clean.
- Report damaged packaging immediately.
- Collect and dispose of plastic pellets and product residues properly.
- Report environmental incidents without delay.

Operation Clean Sweep (OCS)

Operation Clean Sweep (OCS) aims prevent plastic pellets from entering the environment.

Even small quantities of plastic pellets can have a significant impact on the environment and waterways.

Every driver contributes to the success of OCS by working carefully and remaining vigilant.

Behavior Based Safety is more than following rules.

It means:

- Protecting people
- Taking responsibility
- Communication openly
- Learning from experience
- Making safer decisions every day
