

Operating rules for the lookout point

Operator: Pilsen Zoological and Botanical Garden, subsidized organization

1. The lookout point is open to the public free of charge and has no staff. Access is only permitted during daytime.
2. Visitors use the lookout point at their own risk and responsibility.
3. The number of people allowed on the lookout point at any one time is limited to a maximum of 5.
5. During group visits, there must be at least one responsible person over the age of 18 on the lookout point to supervise the group. This person is required to familiarize themselves with these operating rules and to familiarize the people they are supervising as well.
4. Children under 12 years of age are only allowed to enter when accompanied by a person over 18 years of age who is fully legally competent and capable. Persons over 12 years of age are allowed to enter at their own risk.
5. Visitors are required to ascend and descend only by ladder. Visitors are required to wear appropriate footwear, without high heels or slippery soles.
6. When ascending, descending, and moving on the observation deck, it is prohibited to climb on other parts of the structure not designated for this purpose, to intentionally swing the lookout point by a person or group of persons, or to consume alcohol.
7. Persons under the influence of alcohol or addictive substances are prohibited from entering the lookout point. Persons with health problems or other limitations that could endanger their own safety or the safety of others on the lookout point are also prohibited from entering.
8. It is prohibited to:
 - lean over the railing of the lookout point
 - throw or drop any objects from the lookout point
 - stay in the lookout point area and its surroundings before, during, and immediately after a storm
 - write, paint, or otherwise damage the structure and equipment of the lookout point
 - store, attach, or hang any objects on the structure of the lookout point
9. Entry to the lookout point is prohibited in conditions of reduced visibility (fog), frost, snow, strong wind, or storms. If a visitor enters the lookout point under these adverse conditions, they do so entirely at their own risk, and neither the manufacturer nor the owner are responsible for their health or safety.
10. When climbing up and down the ladder and moving around the viewing platform, special care must be taken, in particular to hold onto the handrails, not to push ahead, and not to crowd.
11. In the event of any danger or emergency, every visitor is obliged to inform the operator of the lookout point immediately.
12. The condition of the structure is regularly checked by the responsible maintenance staff.
