PASADENA

There's more to explore beyond the city's rose-hued reputation.

Why Now: In the early years of Pasadena's founding—it was officially established in 1874—the city launched one of the most well-known events in the country: The Tournament of Roses. Today, the annual parade and bowl game draw hundreds of thousands of visitors to the foothills of the San Gabriel Mountains. But

it's the world-class shopping, varied museums, impressive architecture and more than 650 restaurants that keep them coming back.

Where to Go: The iconic Langham Huntington hotel has been a landmark for more than a century. Guests enjoy elegantly furnished suites or cottages, each boasting sweeping views

of the mountains or the site's famed landscape. For a low-key breakfast, hit Lincoln Pasadena. Daily made baked goods beckon from the pastry case, and a large menu offers huevos rancheros, hash brown Benedict and more. Buy a gift from the items on display on your way out. On the second Sunday of the month, head 10 minutes south

for a true Pasadena tradition. The Rose Bowl Flea Market—dating back to 1968—hosts 2,500-plus vendors peddling everything from housewares and art to vintage clothing and vinyl. Tip: Wear comfy shoes and your haggling hat. Set in Pasadena's historic train station, The Luggage Room Pizzeria turns out quality wood-fired pies with toppings piled on a sourdough crust. If a nightcap is in order, Blind Donkey is a good choice. Whiskey cocktails are the star at this laid-back bar on Union Street, but beer, wine and other cocktails are also on offer.
